Parent teacher meetings are an effective way for parents and teachers to interact and discuss their child's progress. On the other hand, it also helps parents to properly communicate and coordinate with the teacher regarding the participation of their child in class and in different activities.

Rowan's law Day

Rowan Stringer loved rugby. A competitive and keen athlete, she was captain of her high school's team. Tragically, in May 2013, 17-year old Rowan died as the result of head injuries she sustained while playing rugby. Second-impact syndrome (SIS) occurs when the brain swells rapidly, and catastrophically, after a person suffers a second concussion before symptoms from an earlier one have subsided. This second blow may occur minutes, days or weeks after an initial concussion, and even the mildest grade of concussion can lead to SIS.

The CDC reports an average of 1.5 deaths per year from sports concussions.

WIHS honoured her memory on September 25th to bring awareness to concussions and concussion safety.
